

Pressure injury prevention resources available to ARC on healthLearn

A range of educational resources are available via healthLearn, including pressure injury prevention courses and a forum. We summarise three resources of interest below.

1. Online course: Pressure Injury Prevention – the SSKIN Model.

Recommended for healthcare assistants, registered nurses and enrolled nurses. Estimated time to complete: 1-2 hours.

This course has been developed by wound care specialists throughout New Zealand and familiarises staff with the SSKIN pressure injury assessment framework. Six scenarios are available to work through, we recommend selecting the 'Aged Care' and 'Acute Care' as most relevant to ARC staff. These scenarios are followed by a series of short quizzes to complete.

2. Online course: Pressure Injury Prevention

Recommended for registered nurses and enrolled nurses. Estimated time to complete: 2 hours.

The aim of this online course is to provide you an opportunity to update staff knowledge on pressure injury prevention and assessment, and to apply this knowledge within the clinical workplace.

3. Pressure injury prevention community of practice

Recommended for healthcare workers of all backgrounds. Resources may be particularly useful to Clinical Managers for use in quality improvement activities.

The Pressure Injury Prevention Community of Practice (PIPCoP) aims to develop an evidence based, data driven community of practice (CoP) to significantly reduce pressure injuries nationwide. This online forum will share of PIP quality improvement activities, best practice learning, resources and to provide collegial support and leadership.

Accessing healthLearn

healthLearn is a website owned and maintained through the Te Waipounamu/South Island Alliance Programme Office. Aged Residential Care providers in the South Island are able to access healthLearn once they have established a memorandum of understanding (MOU).
